

OVERRULE

Meaning: To overrule means to reject or invalidate a decision, objection, or recommendation by exercising authority or power.

1. The judge decided to overrule the objection based on precedent.
2. Despite the committee's recommendations, the manager chose to overrule their decisions.
3. In a surprising turn of events, the board voted to overrule the CEO's proposal.
4. The teacher had to overrule the student's request for an extension on the assignment.
5. Legislators can overrule a presidential veto with a two-thirds majority vote.
