

OVERTRIP

Meaning: Overtrip: (verb) to exceed a safe or intended limit, resulting in a failure or overflow, particularly in contexts such as mechanical systems or natural boundaries.

2. After the storm, the river's water level rose significantly, leading to an overtrip of its banks.
