

PARALOGY

Meaning: Paralogy is a logical fallacy or error in reasoning that occurs when concepts are misapplied or misunderstood, often leading to irrelevant conclusions in discourse.

1. Paralogy often arises in philosophical discussions where concepts are misapplied or misunderstood.
2. The speaker's argument was criticized for its paralogy, as it strayed from the original topic without clear justification.
3. In literature, paralogy can create interesting layers of meaning when authors intentionally juxtapose disparate ideas.
4. The scientist's conclusions were challenged for relying on paralogy rather than solid empirical evidence.
5. Many debates in ethics can devolve into paralogy, with participants failing to address the central moral questions.
