

PARATAXIS

Meaning: Parataxis is a rhetorical device that involves the placing of clauses or phrases one after another without conjunctions, often to create a sense of urgency or to juxtapose contrasting ideas.

1. Parataxis can create a sense of urgency in writing by presenting ideas in rapid succession.
2. The poet employed parataxis to juxtapose contrasting images without the use of conjunctions.
3. In her speech, the use of parataxis made the message more impactful and memorable.
4. Parataxis often reflects a stream-of-consciousness style, revealing the speaker's thoughts in real time.
5. Many modern authors favor parataxis for its ability to convey complex emotions with simplicity.

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
