

# PEREMPT

*Meaning: To preempt means to leave no opportunity for denial or refusal; to decide or act decisively and authoritatively.*

1. His decision to leave was preempt, leaving no room for debate among the team members.
2. The judge issued a preempt order, compelling the defendant to appear in court without delay.
3. She made a preempt statement that silenced all further discussion on the topic.
4. In negotiations, his preempt demands caught everyone off guard and shifted the dynamics completely.
5. The preempt nature of her request made it clear that there would be no negotiation on the terms.
