

PERIGRAPH

Meaning: Perigraph: a line or drawing that outlines the boundary or perimeter of a specific area, often used in cartography to denote significant geographical features.

1. The cartographer carefully marked the perimeter of the new territory using a perigraph.
2. In ancient maps, a perigraph often highlighted significant geographical features.
3. To enhance the accuracy of the document, she added a detailed perigraph around the main city.
4. The perigraph served as a visual boundary, distinguishing the protected area from the surrounding land.
5. Historians noted the use of a perigraph in the early exploration maps, indicating where settlements were established.
