

PHOTOPHORE

Meaning: Photophore: a light-producing organ found in certain organisms, such as deep-sea fish and bioluminescent creatures, used to attract prey or mates.

1. The deep-sea anglerfish uses a photophore to lure unsuspecting prey into its jaws.
2. Many bioluminescent organisms possess photophores that emit light to attract mates.
3. Researchers are studying the photophores of certain jellyfish to understand their complex light-emitting mechanisms.
4. The photophores on the sides of some squids help them camouflage by matching the light from above.
5. In dark ocean depths, the photophore serves as both an offensive and defensive adaptation for many marine species.

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
