

PLIM

Meaning: PLIM (verb): to swell or rise, especially in response to absorbing water, as seen in boats or wooden structures.

1. The old wooden boat began to plim as it took on water during the storm.
2. She watched the plim of the docked vessel as the tide rose higher.
3. With each wave, the small canoe would plim gently against the shore.
4. The fishermen noticed how their gear would plim whenever they cast their lines.
5. As the rain fell, the logs in the river started to plim, creating ripples on the surface.
