*Meaning: Postpositive (adjective): relating to an adjective that is placed after the noun it modifies, as seen in certain languages and phrases.*

1. In the phrase "the president elect," the term "elect" is a postpositive adjective that follows the noun it modifies.

4. The postpositive position of the adjective "only" in "the people only" emphasizes the exclusivity of the subject.
