

POSTSCRIBE

Meaning: Postscribe (verb): to add supplementary material, such as a chapter or letter, at the end of a written work.

1. The author decided to postscribe the additional chapter to provide more context for the story.
2. In the revised edition, the publisher chose to postscribe a letter from the main character.
3. After the meeting, she agreed to postscribe the new policy updates in the official minutes.
4. He wanted to postscribe a thank-you note at the end of the report to acknowledge everyone's efforts.
5. To enhance the reader's understanding, the editor suggested to postscribe a glossary of terms at the back of the book.
