

PREBENDARY

Meaning: Prebendary: a clergyman who is granted a prebend, or a stipend, from the revenues of a cathedral or church, often responsible for specific duties or oversight within the ecclesiastical community.

1. The prebendary was honored for his years of dedicated service to the cathedral.
2. After much deliberation, the church appointed a new prebendary to oversee the parish's finances.
3. In medieval England, a prebendary often received a portion of the church's income without having to perform all the duties of a full clergyman.
