Meaning: To come before something in time or order.

1. The thunderstorm will precede the heavy rain expected later in the evening.
2. In her speech, she emphasized how kindness should always precede criticism.
3. The introduction of the new policy will precede the implementation phase by several months.
4. Cultural rituals often precede important events, marking their significance.
5. Changes in leadership typically precede a shift in company direction and strategy.
