Meaning: PREDOOM (verb): To condemn or sentence to failure or misfortune in advance, often due to negative expectations or judgments.

1. His pessimistic outlook seemed to predoom the project to failure before it even began.
2. The critic's harsh review appeared to predoom the film to a swift exit from theaters.
3. She felt that her constant worry might predoom her chances of finding happiness.
4. The unfavorable weather forecast seemed to predoom their outdoor wedding plans.
5. Without adequate preparation, the team's lack of confidence threatened to predoom their performance.
