

PREFIGURATION

Meaning: PREFIGURATION: the act of representing or suggesting something that will occur in the future, often used in art or literature to foreshadow later developments.

1. The artist's work was a prefiguration of the modernist movement that would emerge decades later.
2. In literature, prefiguration often serves as a foreshadowing device to hint at future events.
3. The concept of prefiguration can be seen in various religious texts, where earlier events symbolize later revelations.
4. Some philosophers argue that prefiguration allows for a deeper understanding of historical narratives by connecting past and future.
5. The film's plot is a prefiguration of societal changes that the director believed were inevitable.
