2. His theories about technology prefigured many of the innovations we see today.
3. Literature from that era often prefigured the social changes that would emerge later.
4. The scientist's predictions prefigured the groundbreaking discoveries in genetics.
5. Her vision for the future appears to prefigure a new wave of environmental consciousness.
