Meaning: Premonish (verb): to warn or forewarn someone about a future event or danger.

1. She seemed to premonish him of the impending storm with her worried expression.
2. The old man would often premonish the villagers about the dangers lurking in the woods.
3. His dreams began to premonish events that would later unfold in his waking life.
4. As the dark clouds gathered, she felt an instinctual urge to premonish her friends to stay indoors.
5. The eerie silence in the air served to premonish them that something unusual was about to happen.
