Meaning: Prentice: a young apprentice or learner, particularly in a trade or craft, who is under the guidance of a master.

1. The young artist was an eager prentice, absorbing every lesson from his master.
2. In medieval times, a prentice would often spend years learning a trade before becoming a journeyman.
3. Her father had been a prentice in the local blacksmith shop, where he honed his skills.
4. As a prentice baker, she learned the delicate balance of flavors and textures in her craft.
5. The prentice observed the experienced craftsman closely, hoping to replicate his techniques.
