Meaning: To presuppose means to assume or take for granted something as a basis for an argument or conclusion.

1. The study seemed to presuppose that technology would inevitably lead to greater social isolation.
2. Her argument presupposes that all participants have equal access to resources, which is often not the case.
3. In his analysis, the author presupposed a direct correlation between education levels and economic growth.
4. The research presupposes that climate change will have a more severe impact on coastal cities than inland areas.
5. To effectively address the issue, we must first presuppose the motivations behind each stakeholder's actions.
