Meaning: Preterition is the rhetorical device of deliberately omitting or passing over a subject while still drawing attention to it.

1. His speech was marked by a notable preterition of the recent scandals, which left many in the audience puzzled.
2. In literature, preterition serves as a rhetorical device to draw attention to a subject while ostensibly ignoring it.
3. The lawyer's strategic preterition of certain evidence during the trial raised eyebrows among the jurors.
