

# PRORATABLE

*Meaning: Proratable refers to the ability to allocate or distribute costs or benefits proportionally based on a specific factor, such as usage or participation.*

1. The costs associated with the project are proratable based on the number of participants.
2. In the event of early termination, any non-used vacation days will be proratable to the employee's final paycheck.
3. The landlord agreed that the utilities would be proratable among the tenants according to their lease agreements.
4. During the financial review, the accountant noted that some expenses were not proratable and would need to be covered in full.
5. For tax purposes, the fees incurred during the first quarter are proratable to ensure accurate reporting.
