

# PROROGUE

*Meaning: Prorogue: to suspend or discontinue a session of a legislative assembly, typically until a specified future date.*

1. The government decided to prorogue parliament until after the elections.
2. After much debate, the prime minister chose to prorogue the session rather than face a vote of no confidence.
3. The speaker announced that the assembly would be prorogued for the summer recess.
4. Many citizens were outraged when they learned the legislature would be prorogued indefinitely.
5. In an unusual move, the governor chose to prorogue the state legislature to avoid a contentious vote.
