

PROSCRIPT

Meaning: Proscript (noun): a formal prohibition or ban, often associated with punitive measures against individuals or practices deemed harmful or undesirable.

1. The government announced a proscript against the use of certain pesticides deemed harmful to the environment.
2. In ancient Rome, a proscript was often a death warrant for those deemed enemies of the state.
3. The new law included a proscript that barred individuals with criminal records from holding public office.

5. The proscript aimed to eliminate hate speech in public forums, sparking a debate about freedom of expression.
