

PUNT-OUT

Meaning: PUNT-OUT (verb): To defer or abandon a decision or action in order to avoid risk or due to limitations, such as time.

1. The team decided to punt-out on the final play rather than risk a turnover.
2. During the meeting, we had to punt-out on several topics due to time constraints.
3. In the debate, he chose to punt-out on the controversial question rather than take a stand.
4. When the project hit a snag, the manager suggested they punt-out until they had more information.
5. She felt it was better to punt-out on the complex issue than to provide an incomplete answer.
