Meaning: To quibble means to argue or raise objections about a trivial matter.

1. It's not worth it to quibble over such a minor detail in the report.
2. During the meeting, they spent hours quibbling instead of making a decision.
3. She was known to quibble about the smallest issues, which frustrated her colleagues.
4. Rather than quibble about the price, they decided to negotiate for a better deal.
5. He always seemed to quibble over the rules, looking for loopholes to exploit.
6. She didn't want to quibble over the small details when the overall project was a success.
7. The lawyer advised his client not to quibble about the terms of the settlement agreement.
8. It's pointless to quibble about who arrived at the solution first; what matters is that we solved the problem together.
