

QUITTANCE

Meaning: Quittance: a formal release or discharge from a debt or obligation.

1. After weeks of negotiation, she finally received her quittance from the landlord.
2. The lawyer presented the quittance to confirm that the debt had been fully settled.
3. He was relieved to see the quittance in hand, marking the end of a long financial struggle.
4. The quittance served as proof that she had fulfilled her obligations under the contract.
5. Without the quittance, there would be no way to prove that the loan had been repaid.
6. The landlord issued a quittance to confirm that the tenant had paid all outstanding rent.
7. After settling his debts, he received a formal quittance from the creditor.
8. In the old contract, a quittance was required to release the party from any further obligations.
9. The lawyer advised her to keep the quittance as proof of payment for future reference.
10. Once the final payment was made, the company sent a quittance to acknowledge the transaction.
