

REAPPORTION

Meaning: Reapportion means to redistribute or allocate something, such as electoral districts or resources, based on new data or changes in circumstances.

1. The state legislature decided to reapportion the electoral districts to reflect the latest population data.
2. After the census results were released, officials began to reapportion funding to ensure equitable resource distribution.
3. In order to enhance representation, the committee proposed a plan to reapportion the seats in the city council.
4. As demographics shifted, the need to reapportion the congressional districts became increasingly apparent.
5. The nonprofit organization worked tirelessly to reapportion community resources to better serve underprivileged neighborhoods.
