

REARGUE

Meaning: To present or argue a case or position again, often with additional evidence or clarification.

1. The attorney decided to reargue the case in light of new evidence presented by the witness.
2. In her essay, she chose to reargue the main points to strengthen her overall argument.
3. After reviewing the feedback, he felt it was necessary to reargue his position during the next meeting.
4. The professor encouraged students to reargue their viewpoints to develop critical thinking skills.
5. During the debate, the candidate attempted to reargue his stance on healthcare despite previous criticism.

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
