

RE CROSS

Meaning: Recross (verb): to cross again, often used in legal contexts to refer to a lawyer's follow-up questioning of a witness after redirect examination, or in general contexts to traverse a path or area once more.

1. After the initial rebuttal, the lawyer decided to recross the witness to clarify their statements.
2. The climber needed to recross the icy ridge carefully to ensure their safety.
3. She had to recross the river at dawn to reach the village in time for the festival.
4. In the debate, the candidate chose to recross the points made by their opponent for emphasis.
5. The children laughed as they recrossed the jump rope, eager to try again.
