

REGILD

Meaning: Regild (verb): to apply a new layer of gold or gold-like finish to an object, restoring or enhancing its appearance.

1. After years of neglect, the historic building was finally regilded, restoring its former glory.
2. The artist decided to regild the frame to enhance the painting's vibrant colors.
3. In an effort to revitalize the old park, the community planned to regild the decorative elements of the fountain.
4. The antique mirror was regilded, making it a stunning centerpiece in the living room.
