

REGRANT

Meaning: Regrant (verb): to grant something again, such as scholarships or property, to individuals or entities, often under specific conditions or circumstances.

1. The university decided to regrant the scholarships to students who demonstrated financial need.
2. After reviewing the application, the committee chose to regrant the land to its original owners.
3. The council will regrant the funding next year to support local community projects.
4. In a surprising move, the board voted to regrant the patents to the original inventors.
5. She worked tirelessly to regrant her position after being temporarily replaced during the merger.
