

REMANDMENT

Meaning: Remandment refers to the act of sending a suspect back into custody or detention pending further legal proceedings or investigation.

1. The judge issued a remandment to ensure that the suspect would not flee before trial.
2. After reviewing the evidence, the court decided that a remandment was necessary for further investigation.
3. The defendant's lawyer filed a motion to challenge the remandment imposed by the magistrate.
4. In cases of serious offenses, remandment can often lead to prolonged detention.
5. The remandment was granted due to concerns about the defendant's potential risk to public safety.
