

REPLEAD

Meaning: To replead means to submit a new or amended pleading in a legal case, often in response to new evidence or a court ruling.

1. The attorney decided to replead the case after discovering new evidence.

3. The defendant's legal team advised them to replead in order to strengthen their argument.
