

REPRIMAND

Meaning: REPRIMAND: to officially rebuke or scold someone for a wrongdoing or misconduct.

1. The teacher decided to reprimand the student for repeatedly arriving late to class.
2. After reviewing the reports, the manager felt it necessary to reprimand the employee for poor performance.
3. During the meeting, the team leader issued a reprimand to those who failed to meet the project deadline.
4. Despite his initial frustration, she chose to address the issue with a reprimand rather than a harsh punishment.
5. The principal's reprimand served as a wake-up call for the students to take their studies more seriously.
