Meaning: Reproof is a noun that refers to an expression of disapproval or criticism, often intended as guidance or correction.

1. Her gentle reproof came as a surprise, as I had expected praise for my efforts.
2. The teacher's reproof was delivered with such kindness that it felt more like guidance than criticism.
3. After receiving his father's reproof, he reflected on his actions and vowed to do better.
