Meaning: To reseal means to arrange or assign seats again, typically to improve organization or facilitate interaction.

1. The teacher decided to reseal the students to encourage better collaboration during group projects.
2. After the event, we had to reseal the chairs to make room for the guests at the reception.
3. Due to the unexpected increase in attendees, the organizers had to reseal everyone at the last minute.
4. She felt nervous when the facilitator announced that they would reseal participants based on their performance.
5. To improve the view of the stage, the staff began to reseal the audience in the back rows.
