

RESORB

Meaning: RESORB: to absorb again or to take back into the body, particularly in the context of biological processes where excess or old material is reabsorbed and replaced.

1. The body will resorb the excess calcium over time, restoring balance to the system.
2. During the healing process, the bone tissue can resorb old material and replace it with new growth.
3. In certain medical treatments, the body is encouraged to resorb damaged cartilage to improve mobility.
4. When a tooth is lost, the surrounding bone may begin to resorb, leading to changes in facial structure.
5. Researchers are studying how certain drugs can help the body resorb fat more effectively.
