Meaning: Retund (verb): to reverse or withdraw a previous decision or action.

1. The lawyer decided to retund the client's case after discovering new evidence.
2. In an unexpected turn of events, the committee chose to retund their earlier decision regarding the funding.
3. After reviewing the feedback, the team agreed it was best to retund the proposal for further refinement.
4. She felt it was necessary to retund the invitation when she realized she would be out of town.
5. The professor chose to retund the lecture topic to better align with student interests.
