

REVETMENT

Meaning: Revetment is a protective structure, typically made of stone or other materials, built along a shoreline or riverbank to prevent erosion and stabilize the land against water forces.

1. The coastal revetment was built to protect the shoreline from erosion caused by storm surges.
2. Engineers designed a stone revetment to stabilize the riverbank against the force of the flowing water.
3. After heavy rains, the revetment showed signs of damage, prompting immediate repairs to ensure safety.
4. The construction of the revetment along the harbor significantly reduced the impact of wave action on the docks.
5. Many environmentalists argue that while revetments provide short-term protection, they can disrupt natural habitats.
