

SACKCLOTH

Meaning: Sackcloth is a coarse, rough fabric traditionally worn as a symbol of mourning, repentance, or humility.

1. The villagers wore sackcloth as a sign of mourning for their lost leader.
2. In times of repentance, many would don sackcloth to express their sorrow and humility.
3. The artist chose sackcloth as the medium for her latest installation, highlighting themes of poverty and struggle.
4. During the festival, participants wrapped themselves in colorful sackcloth to honor their cultural heritage.
5. The old man kept a piece of sackcloth in his pocket as a reminder of his humble beginnings.
