

# SANKHA

*Meaning: SANKHA: A conch shell used in Hindu rituals and ceremonies, often blown to produce a resonant sound that signifies auspicious beginnings and invites divine blessings.*

1. The sound of the sankha echoed through the temple, signaling the start of the ceremony.
2. During the festival, the priests played the sankha to invite the blessings of the deities.
3. Listening to the haunting melody of the sankha brought back memories of my childhood visits to the village.
4. The sankha, or conch shell, is often used in Hindu rituals as a symbol of purity and auspiciousness.
5. As the sun set, the rhythmic blowing of the sankha added a spiritual ambiance to the evening gathering.
