

SCAPEGOAT

Meaning: A scapegoat is a person or group that is unfairly blamed for problems or misfortunes, often to divert attention from the true causes.

1. In many cultures, the concept of a scapegoat has been used to explain misfortune and blame others for societal issues.
2. During the investigation, the manager was made a scapegoat for the team's poor performance despite the larger systemic problems.
