

SCURFF

Meaning: SCURFF (verb): To remove or scrape off a surface layer, often referring to paint or debris; (noun): a layer of debris or residue, such as seaweed or old paint.

1. The artist decided to scurf off the old paint from the wooden surface before applying a fresh coat.
2. As I walked along the beach, I couldn't help but notice the scurf of seaweed piling up by the shore.
3. After the intense workout, I had to scurf the excess sweat from my brow.
