Meaning: To seize or take possession of something, often with legal authority or urgency.

1. The lawyer decided to seize the opportunity to present his case at the trial.
2. In a dramatic turn of events, the authorities were able to seize the stolen artwork from the gallery.
3. The team worked diligently to seize control of the project before the deadline approached.
4. After much deliberation, the committee chose to seize the moment and make a bold statement.
5. The police were compelled to seize the evidence that would lead to the suspect's conviction.
