

# SELF-IMPOSTURE

*Meaning: Self-imposture refers to the act of falsely presenting oneself as having certain qualities or expertise, often leading to deception or failure when the truth is revealed.*

2. The artist's self-imposture led to a series of failed exhibitions, as critics quickly saw through the facade.
3. She realized that her self-imposture was damaging her relationships, as friends felt deceived by her false persona.

5. The self-imposture of the so-called guru was exposed when former followers shared their stories of disillusionment.
