Meaning: To sermonish means to deliver a moral lecture or admonition, often in a didactic or preachy manner.

1. The teacher tended to sermonish her students about the importance of honesty.
2. During the meeting, he sermonished his colleagues on the need for better communication.
3. She found his sermonishing tone off-putting, especially when discussing personal choices.
4. The pastor's ability to sermonish without being overly harsh impressed the congregation.
5. After the incident, his friends felt it necessary to sermonish him about responsible behavior.
