

SIDE-TAKING

Meaning: Side-taking refers to the act of openly aligning oneself with a particular party or position in a discussion or conflict.

1. Side-taking during the negotiation often complicates the resolution process.
2. In the debate, her side-taking was evident as she firmly supported her party's stance.
3. The teacher encouraged her students to discuss issues without side-taking to promote open dialogue.
4. His side-taking alienated some of his colleagues who were looking for a more neutral approach.
5. Side-taking can lead to entrenched positions, making it difficult to find common ground.

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
