Meaning: To sidle means to move sideways or in a stealthy manner, often to avoid detection or to approach quietly.

1. She tried to sidle past the group of teenagers without drawing attention to herself.
2. As the cat attempted to sidle closer to the bird, it moved nervously on its perch.
3. He sidled up to the bar, hoping to catch the bartender's eye for a drink.
4. The child would often sidle up to his mother when he felt shy in unfamiliar situations.
5. During the meeting, she would sidle over to her colleague to share a quiet joke.
