

# SILIQUA

*Meaning: SILIQUA: A unit of weight used in ancient Rome, equivalent to 1/172 of a pound, and also a type of elongated fruit that splits open at maturity.*

1. The siliqua, a unit of weight in ancient Roman times, was often used to measure precious metals.
2. In botanical terms, a siliqua refers to a type of elongated fruit that splits open when ripe.
3. The ancient coinage system included the siliqua as a standard measure for gold and silver.
4. During the lecture, the professor explained how the siliqua has influenced both historical trade and modern currency.
5. Botanists noted that the siliqua of the plant contained seeds that were essential for its propagation.
