Meaning: Subaud (verb): To imply or suggest something indirectly or subtly, often by conveying unspoken meanings or nuances.

1. The poet's words seemed to subaud the unspoken thoughts of the audience.

3. His laughter had a subaud quality, hinting at deeper emotions beneath the surface.
