

# SYNECDOCHE

*Meaning: Synecdoche is a figure of speech in which a part of something is used to represent the whole, or vice versa.*

1. The phrase "all hands on deck" is a classic example of synecdoche, where hands represent the sailors.
2. In literature, synecdoche often enhances the meaning by using a part to represent the whole.
3. When someone says "the White House announced a new policy," they are employing synecdoche by referring to the administration.
4. In everyday conversation, referring to cars as "wheels" demonstrates how synecdoche can simplify language.
5. The use of synecdoche in the line "the crown will find an heir" shows how a part, the crown, symbolizes royal authority.

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
